WATAN concluded 2015 with 1,310,716 beneficiaries. WATAN was able to reach them through institutes that operate in different sectors and with several partners in Syria. There are over 80 partners including a large number of global humanitarian organisations.







Khayr is very active in the water and sanitation sector through many projects and activities in a number of Syrian cities as well as refugee camps along the border.

The projects established in this area in 2015 provide long terms services aimed at targeted communities. These include supplying water, waste disposal and sanitation services.

Projects:

Supplying water - hygiene baskets and campaigns - waste disposal - sewage systems - sanitation projects - water tanks and pumping stations - building block toilets.

Food Security and Livelihood

An overview:

Food security and livelihood sectors are the main sectors that WATAN, through Khayr, work on. The need is no longer limited to food, it is now about how a person can insure food and have the means to provide for themselves. For this reasons Khayr focuses on agriculture and livestock as essential means for food security in Syrians cities. There have been many projects that support livelihood means.

In collaboration with the Syrian Business Club, WATAN was able to provide a number of activities to Syrian refugees in Turkey that contribute to supporting livelihoods such as professional training courses, how to organise professional meetings, as well as participating in professional events. In addition, there is also the wool workshop in Reyhanli, Turkey, which was founded in 2012 and employs Syrian refugee women in Reyhanli. Each handmade item reflects the story of the hardships that each of these women faced.

In addition, many specialized centres have been set up that offer free services for patients, emergency response campaigns as well as vaccine and prevention campaigns.



Orphans project: The orphans project is a permanent and ongoing project of the organisation since 2013. Khayr supports hundreds of Syrian children in several areas in Syria, Lebanon and Turkey. The main aim is to protect orphans within their communities through providing for them so that they can lead decent lives. These orphans are also provided with health, social and educational care and when needed psychological care, as well as promoting and developing creative thinking.

Psychological support project: In the past 4 years Generation Freedom has provided psychological support programmes. This was done in collaboration with many partners such as University of Manchester, UK. In addition, 2 psychotherapy centres were opened in Lebanon in collaboration with OTI, AID US and there are over 10,700 beneficiaries from these projects.

Since June 2012 WATAN, through Generation Freedom, has run several schools in Turkey, Lebanon and in Syria. They have trained staff members that are expected to perform their best. Education is not limited to the traditional form of teaching, where there are varied activities on a daily basis that contribute to the development of the students personality and takes an interest in supporting and developing talent and unique capabilities.

WATAN does not only provide services for students up to secondary school. In fact since last year AFAQ was launched. AFAQ supports and mentors university students from when they complete high school until they graduate from university through a range of activities, student seminars, news of scholarship opportunities and how to receive grants. In addition, there are also workshops that bring together Syrian and Turkish students to discuss the challenges they face in integrating into the Turkish university community. Many educational needs of students in different age groups are met. Last year there were 200 beneficiaries including university students and students that had been accepted into university.

Since it was established, WATAN has focused on training and qualifying workers in civil society organizations in different areas of community and charity work within

specialised fields. WATAN also works on capacity building through its numerous programmes and SYAN, which specialises in capacity building and has reached thousands of beneficiaries over the last few years. In its initial phase WATAN's capacity building programme reached thousands of beneficiaries. Every year at the WATAN annual conference there are many relevant capacity building workshops for partners in Syria to take part in.


Last year through 2 institutes, SADA and Huriat, WATAN launched the Stop Syrian Holocaust campaign, which aims to:

WATAN 4th Annual Conference "Together"

Partnership in humanitarian work for Syria was the main focus of the WATANS 4th Annual Conference 2015. It was an opportunity to exchange and discuss experiences in humanitarian work priorities. The conference was also an opportunity to launch initiatives aimed at strengthening workers in Syrian and international civil society institutions and to develop their skills. It was a chance to meet with leaders of civil action, and an opportunity to network and build relationships and to gain new perspectives to raise the level of civil work and development. The conference lasted 3 days from 10 - 12 November 2015 in Istanbul, Turkey.

- ▶ The conference focused on aspects of the most important strategic priorities for the next phase in Syrian humanitarian work, namely:
 - Boost the economy in unstable regions by improving livelihoods.
 - Overcome difficulties of the next phase by consolidation of social harmony.
 - Dealing creatively with all aspects of education.
 - Develop the work of Syrian civil society organisations.




